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In 1983, the Owens were one of 100 families who were asked to contribute \$100 each to a tuition assistance fund as part of a program called "The 100 Club." The program was a huge success. In March of 1986, the parish pastor, Father William Cullen, the school board president, future Circuit Court Judge Robert E. Byrne, and Bishop Joseph L. Imesch entered into a written trust agreement which created a trust endowment fund for the general educational purposes of the school.

Today, the 100 Club lives on as St. Petronille's Annual Appeal for LIFE. The appeal first provides tuition assistance to families in need with the remaining funds being transferred into the endowment fund. The earnings from this fund are used to support school needs. A gift to LIFE is a gift that keeps giving.

Growing up as one of ten children, Joe Owens understands the importance of sacrifice and giving-back. He stated, "I knew that my Irish immigrant parents helped build their parish church and school on the south side of Chicago and that it was my duty to do the same thing in my parish in Glen Ellyn...I know, also, that if our Catholic heritage is to survive, it will more surely survive through Catholic school education." There are many kinds of dreams. The dreams and generosity of past and present St. Petronille parishioners continue to provide funds to help educate St. Petronille students in a faith-filled environment.

Her approach to teaching is to be honest and fair to all students. Miss Layden sets high expectations for her students, and she teaches them traits to be successful and have pride in themselves. As an educator, she has utilized different


I graduated from Western Michigan this past June.
